'Curating Ruins' : heritage meets digital fabrication.

Agenda: The aim of the event is to investigate how a mindful creation of memorial intervention within a space can be interjected in both an architectural or installation based response. The site to be investigated is the Church of St Luke, **Liverpool** - a church that was bombed heavily during the Blitz and only it's outer skin remains. After completing initial site analysis, students will begin to formulate their responses in several groups towards providing a scheme that acts in commemoration to 70th anniversary of the end of World War Two. The desired output of the event is to create a response that is conscious of how the building

came into it's current form: combining sensitivity, intrigue and respect.
