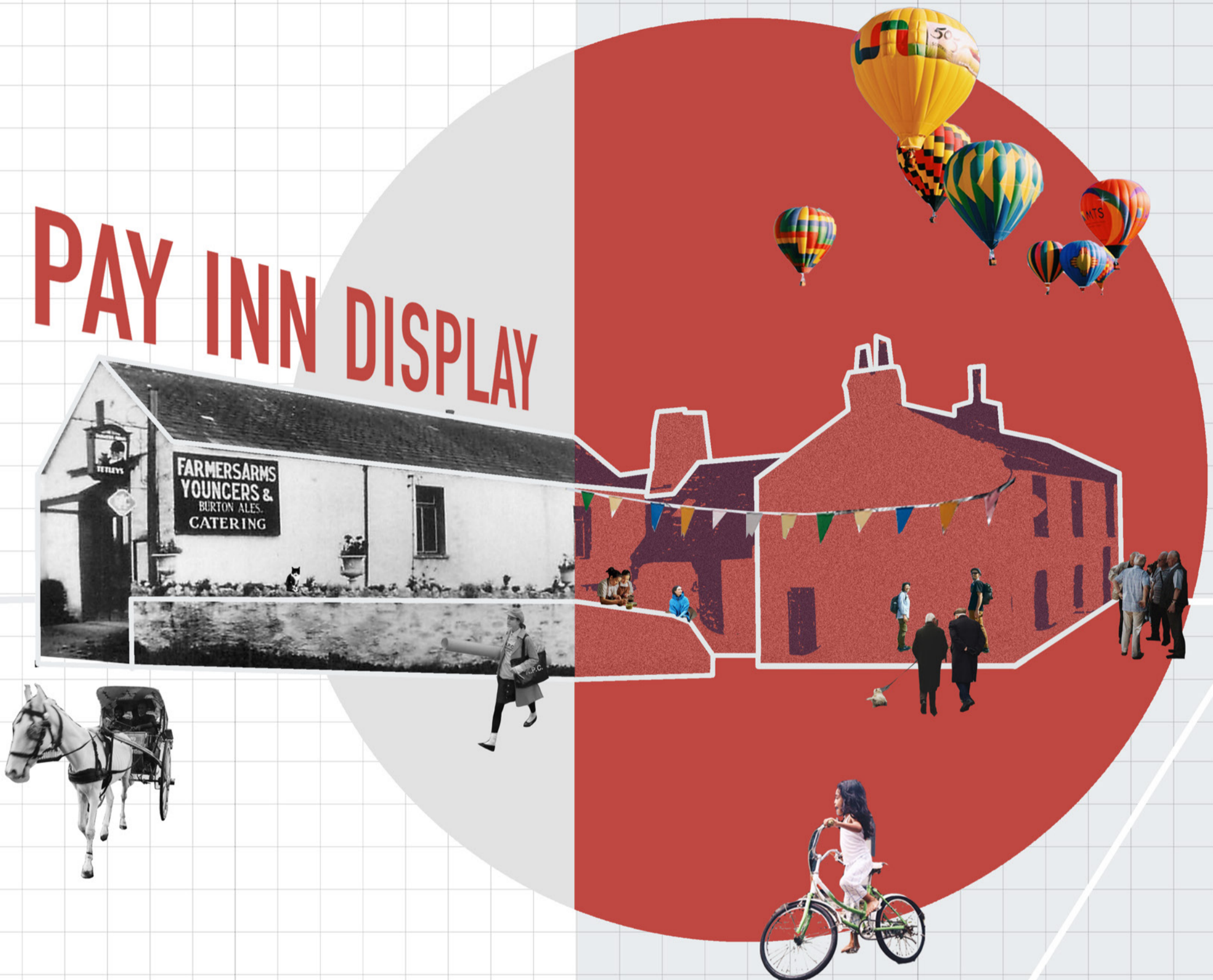

About

This live project will collaborate with Grizedale Arts (an arts organisation based in the English Lake District) to save a neglected historical local inn, re-opening it as a new kind of rural arts centre. Named "The Farmer's Arms", it will be transformed into a creative rural hub, to be enjoyed by both the local community and visitors alike.

Social Impact

The Farmer's Arms will act as a gateway between local communities and the wider world. Not only will it be a working inn that houses spaces for local business' to operate from, but will also act as a centre that offers open access to the arts and new routes into collaborative thinking and exchange.

What You'll Do

After researching the architectural heritage and local context, the final output will be a design proposal to regenerate the car park and entrances into the Farmer's Arms. The regenerated outdoor space will be the entry point to the 'living museum' which, whilst serving outdoor events and functions, will also work to celebrate the existing history.
